POSITIONS IN ACTUARIAL SCIENCE AND QUANTITATIVE RISK MANAGEMENT

GEORGIA STATE UNIVERSITY invites applications for one open rank tenure track or tenured appointment in actuarial science or quantitative risk management and one or more open rank non-tenure track clinical professorships, professors of practice, or lectureships in actuarial science effective Fall 2019 in the Department of Risk Management and Insurance at the Robinson College of Business.

JOB QUALIFICATIONS

Candidates for the tenure track/tenured position must have a completed Ph.D. by the time of the appointment in actuarial science, statistics, applied mathematics, economics, finance or related fields. Applicants at the assistant professor level should have the capability to publish in top actuarial, risk management, statistics/econometrics, economics, finance, and/or applied mathematics journals in the broad area of actuarial science and quantitative risk management. Applicants at more senior levels are expected to have established research records, and have achieved national and international prominence, commensurate with the level of seniority. We are especially interested in candidates who are interested in carrying out research at the interface between data analytics, actuarial science and risk management. Teaching requirements and research support are highly competitive with major research universities.

Applicants for the non-tenure track positions will be considered either for appointments as clinical assistant/associate/full professors if they hold PhDs (and depending on their level of seniority). Applicants who do not hold PhDs will be considered for positions as lecturers or professors of practice. Applicants for the non-tenure track positions are required to hold an actuarial credential from any of the major professional actuarial societies. Successful candidates are expected to manage our B.B.A. program in Actuarial Science. Teaching requirements for the position will be adjusted to reflect the service responsibility of managing our B.B.A. Actuarial Science program. We are an interdisciplinary department and are interested in intellectually curious candidates with versatility in their research and teaching interests.

ABOUT THE ENVIRONMENT

The Department of Risk Management and Insurance at Georgia State University is one of the oldest and most influential risk management programs in the U.S. and has a distinguished history of serving students, alumni, and the risk management profession for more than 60 years. We are currently rated #3 in the *U.S. News and World Report* ranking of RMI programs; we hold a Center of Actuarial Excellence designation from the Society of Actuaries; and we are an Accredited Risk Program according to the Professional Risk Management International Association (PRMIA).

The mission of the department is to better understand how risks faced by individuals, institutions, and societies can be more accurately measured and more efficiently managed. The department has both undergraduate and graduate actuarial science programs, a quantitative risk management program as well as an active PhD program. Our actuarial group is active and visible: for example, we hosted the Congress on *Insurance: Mathematics and Economics* in 2016 and the *Actuarial Research Conference* in 2017.

The salary level and course load are competitive for faculty at business schools in the United States.

PROCESS

Positions are contingent on budget approval. Applications will be accepted until the positions are filled. To apply, a letter of application, curriculum vitae, three recommendation letters, teaching evaluations if any, statement of teaching philosophy, research statement and sample publications should be uploaded to Academicjobsonline.org. All materials must be submitted in Adobe PDF. Please note in your cover letter the position that you are applying: the tenure-track or non-tenure-track position and upload your materials to the link corresponding to the position on Academicjobsonline.org. All positions are subject to financial budget approval.
